

## Refuse



## Reduce



#### Re-use


Re-use items before you think about recycling them. Get creative with what an object's 'second life' might look like - perhaps a jam jar becomes a mug or old bottle caps transform into miniature candles. Re-using can also mean donating something you don't use yourself to someone who needs it.





## Repair
